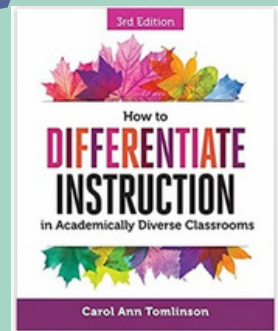


Book Study Now On-Demand

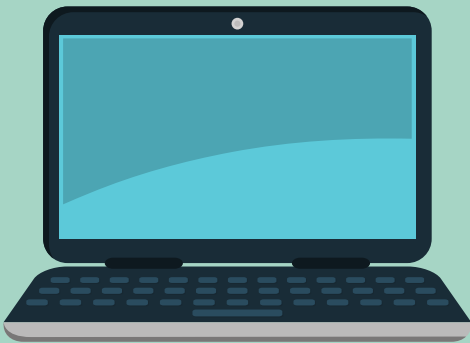
